Eurodac Part of the Dublin System





Main purpose: to facilitate the application of the Dublin Regulation, which determines the Member State responsible for processing an asylum claim.

The Eurodac Regulation was first adopted in 2000 and revised in 2013 including the Dublin III Regulation.

REGULATION (EU) No 603/2013 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 26 June 2013

(has been applicable since 20 July 2015)

Eurodac - Central System


- computerised central database of fingerprint data
 - communication infrastructure

Each Member State shall have a single National Access Point

NAP PL Eurodac - Tasks

- acquisition of data from aliens tenprints cards and verification of search results in the national AFIS
- transfer of fingerprint and verification of search results in Eurodac
- information on AFIS and Eurodac search results
- consultancy to the representatives of the Office for Foreigners, within the competence of NAP Eurodac
- data marking/unmarking, update, erasure
 (at the request of the Office for Foreigners or Border Guard unit)





Eurodac – New functionalities

Comparison of fingerprint data for Law Enforcement Purposes

(preventing, detecting and investigating serious crimes and terrorism):

CAT 4 – on the request of law enforcement agencies

CAT 5 – on the request of Europol





Eurodac – Law Enforcement Access

Designated authorities may submit a reasoned electronic request to the verifying authority, to the comparison of fingerprint data with the data stored in Eurodac.

Central Forensic Laboratory of the Police is the verifying authority for Polish Police











On May 1, 2004, LiveScans network of 30 devices was launched in Poland. (17 in Police units and 13 in Border Guard units)

- Eurodac processing (CS).










Preliminary searches the national AFIS



- one central AFIS
- two logical separated partition
 - > AFIS-C (criminal)
 - AFIS—A (non criminal)
- each new fingerprint set is searched against the whole database




